- "Blessed" in classical Greek was used of the gods
- It does not mean "happy"
- God wants more for you than that



Poor

- Poor in spirit
- To cringe or cower
- Beggar
- Bankruptcy of self
- Yours <u>is</u> the kingdom of God



Hungry

- Hunger for righteousness
- Past sins
- You will be satisfied
- Used of feeding livestock until they want no more



Blaise Pascal

"What is it, then, that this desire and this inability proclaim to us, but that there was once in man a true happiness of which there now remain to him only the mark and empty trace, which he in vain tries to fill from all his surroundings, seeking from things absent the help he does not obtain in things present? **But these are all inadequate, because the infinite abyss can only be filled by an infinite and immutable object, that is to say, only by God Himself...**"

- Matthew has "mourn"
- Occupation
- Weeping is the emotional response to what has come before



Laugh

- Laughing is the result of being made right with God
- Joy over forgiveness and righteousness



Ostracized

- Hate
- Ostracize = aphorizo
 - Apo apart
 - Horizo mark off boundaries
- Scorn your name as evil



Leap

- Be glad and leap for joy
- Behold look, see, perceive
- Your **reward** is great in heaven
